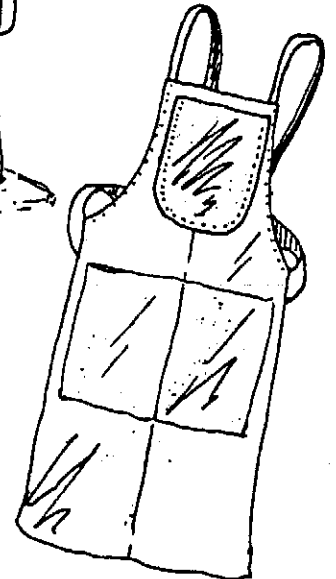
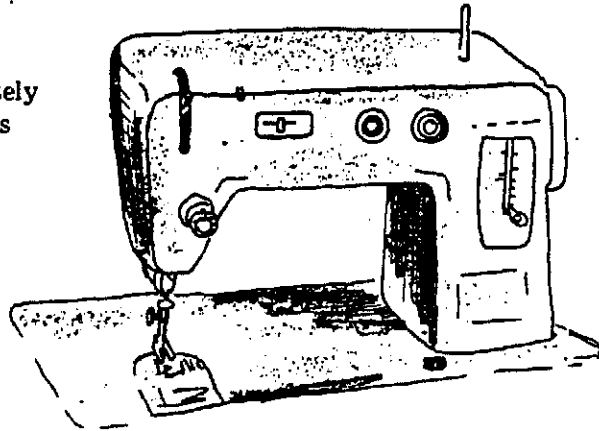

- To do simple hand stitches
