### Make At Least Two

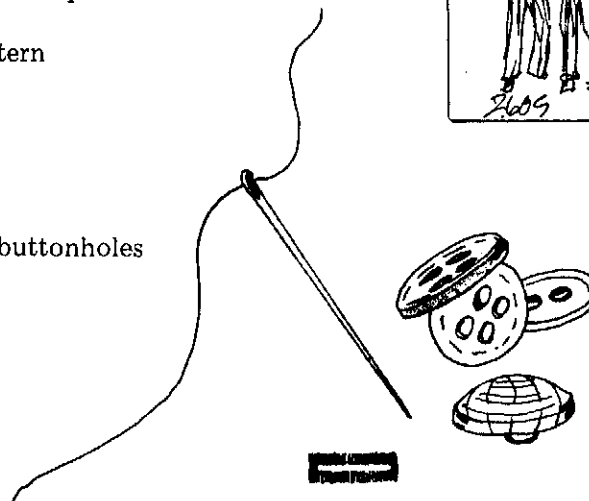
Pullover shirt

### Learn At Least Three New Construction Techniques

To select and use a commercial pattern  
To organize work  
To improve skills  
To lay pattern on fabric  
To sew on single knits  
To finish seams  
To make machine or hand-worked buttonholes  
To interface  
To preshrink notions  
To staystitch  
To apply ribbing  
To sew on buttons
